











Next week I will be attending the New York Alliance of Library Systems twoday retreat in Albany. The New York Alliance of Library Systems, or NYALS, brings together public library systems, school library systems, and 3Rs Councils (our 3R is the South Central Regional Library Council located in Ithaca and serves Finger Lakes Library System, Four County Library System, and Southern Tier Library System). The first day of the retreat starts with a PULISDO, or Public Library System Director Organization.

meeting. The public library system directors throughout the state will be discussing state minimum standards for libraries, and will be meeting with State Library staff for a check-in.

On Thursday afternoon, the NYALS group will work with NYLA staff to go over what their advocacy efforts will be for 2017 and to learn what their projections for the State Budget will be. We will then spend the rest of the afternoon having a panel discussion about delivery in New York State. This is especially an interesting topic for me, since we are the only library system in our 3Rs service area that provides an out-of-system-ILL delivery service to our libraries and patrons.

Friday morning will be spent going over the results of a recent eBook survey that the State Library has conducted. We are then having a presentation about the economic impact of libraries, which I am hoping to have useful information to share with you the following week. I will do an in-depth write-up of the retreat after I return and send it out to library directors.





YA Book of the Week:

Last of the Giants: The Rise and Fall of Earth's Most Dominant Species by Jeff Campbell

Gr 9 Up—The extinctions of giant (both in size and number) species at the mercy of nature and humanity turn out to be a fascinating and jarring lesson for our present. Chronicling the fates of aurochs, moa, passenger pigeons, and sea cows, alongside the unresolved destinies of today's lions and tigers, this work gazes back at evolutionary history through a retrospect that, with the aid of Campbell's humorous and scientific tone, is truly 20/20. Thankfully, the text's explorations of these annihilated species are complex and perceptive and go beyond the usual worn conclusion of human-wrought woe. Mixing geology, ethnography, history, zoology, biology, industry, and sociology, Campbell demonstrates how interconnected Earth's species and societies—human and nonhuman—are. By examining the complex web of evolution through the misfortunes of these lost species, the author drives home that our present is not a final, linear result of history but rather an ever-evolving system that needs care and attention. To that end, a "Call to Action" section laden with resources for the aspiring activist appears at the end; though there is no index, an extensive list of works cited illuminates a path for those who wish to read further. VERDICT Required reading for the budding naturalist and a good pairing for a STEM or

history curriculum, too.—Chelsea Woods, New Brunswick Free Public Library, NJ




Reading History: Polaris can save a patron's reading history to keep track of what the patron has read. The reading history lists information about each item the patron has checked out since the history was turned on, it is not retroactive. Reading history is kept for 3 years or 1000 records. Renewals are not included in the list, but multiple check-outs of the same item are included.

Note: Patrons may view their reading history by accessing their patron account in the PAC. Please be aware that this history can be subpoenaed by law enforcement agencies so it is recommended that the Patron enable this service directly from their PAC account, where a warning will display informing them of this possibility.

- 1. Select Patron Services -> Patron Records or (F7) to find and open the patron's record.
- Select View -> General to display the General view. Then select the Maintain reading list check box.



- 3. Select File -> Save, click the save button, or (Ctrl)+(S) to save the record.
- 4. The next item checked out is displayed in **Patron Status (F6) -> Reader Services** view, after overnight processing is run.
