# **Summer Reading FAQ**

### **Definitions of age groups:**

- Kids/Children Birth 5<sup>th</sup> grade
- Teen Entering 6<sup>th</sup> grade 18
  - Tween (~ages 9-12)
- Adult Out of highschool (18/19) 55
- Caregiver: Any adult who accompanies a child to a program aimed at kids/teens.
- Senior 55+

#### What statistics do I have to collect?

The state tends to change things up every year, but the standard questions and answers include:

- 1. Library Name:
- 2. Contact name: Need the name of the person filling out the form
- 3. Please answer all of the following questions or type N/A where a question does not apply to your library.
  - Did you use the CSLP children's slogan for *year*? Not sure? Did you get a poster from us with the slogan and hang it up? Yes you used it.
  - Did you use the CSLP teen slogan for *year*? See above
  - Did you use the CSLP adult slogan for year? See above
  - Did you use the CSLP Summer Reading Manual for *year*?
    - a. What was the most valuable/most useful 'part' of the manual for you? Opinion
  - TOTAL number of children who registered for the summer reading program in year?
     Do you require registration? This number will always be higher than participants. We are counting registration for the reading component (minutes/books read) and NOT program registration.
  - TOTAL number of teens who registered for the summer reading program in year?
     See above
  - TOTAL number of adults who registered for the summer reading program in year?

#### 4. Reading totals for year:

For participants recording by time read:

If your library collected data on both minutes AND books, do NOT double count participants. The same participants do not get credit for both so choose one. Your library may count statistics for both minutes and books if **different** participants counted that way.
