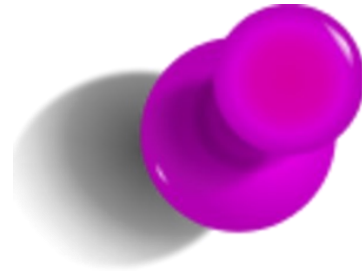

Reminders:

Things to look for with Phishing Emails



Earlier this week Rex sent the following reminder of what to look for when determining if an email is legitimate or not. This is very important!

- In this email they are asking you to “Kindly Update your payment details...”. ****WARNING, WARNING**** (Possible phishing email)
- Do you have an account or payment relationship with the vendor or sender? If No then ****WARNING, WARNING**** (Why would you need to update payment details if you don't pay them for anything)
- Who did it come from? In case it says it is from donotreply@rr.message.com. The part after the @ indicates that it came from a [donotreply] address with a server/host called [rr] at the [message.com] domain. If this was actually from Time Warner it would have come from someone@timewarnercable.com. ****WARNING, WARNING**** (Not who they say they are -- Probably a phishing email)
- Where do the imbedded links point to? In this case, by hovering your cursor over the “Time Warner Cable (TWC) ‘slangmem@twcny.rr.com” hyperlink, an information box pops up with the URL that the link will go to when clicked which is [http://diariovale.com.br/connections/new/bowdle.html] which is definitely not Time Warner. In fact, by looking closely at the domain part of the URL [diariovale.com.br] it tells us that this domain is actually in Brazil. ****WARNING, WARNING**** (Not Time Warner, Definitely a phishing email)
- At this point depending on what you are using for an email client, you should mark this as spam or delete it without clicking on any links.

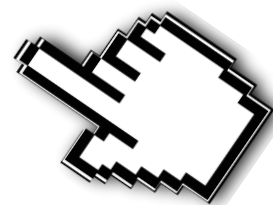
System Updates

YA Book of the Week:



Juliet Takes a Breath by Gabby Rivera

School Library Journal:

/ Starred Review */* Nineteen-year-old Juliet Palante writes a you-changed-my-life letter to her favorite feminist author and is granted a summer internship at the author's home in Portland, OR. Leaving her loving Puerto Rican family in the Bronx is difficult, but Juliet also welcomes the chance to enter a new environment: her mother has been communicating with her through closed doors ever since Juliet told her that she is a lesbian and has a girlfriend. In Portland, Juliet discovers a new world—gay, artsy, "crunchy," hippie types who welcome her with open arms and offer her marijuana. She falls in love, her heroes fall, her family supports her, and her friends save her. Juliet also discovers women of color writing science fiction, hot library paraprofessionals, and her own self-esteem. At the end of the summer, Juliet reflects, "I'm a messy, over-emotional, book nerd, weirdo, chubby brown human and I needed to learn how to love myself, even the shameful bits." This humorous and heartbreaking summer coming-of-age tale is reminiscent of

Isabel Quintero's 2015 Morris Award winner *Gabi, a Girl in Pieces*. Teens will appreciate the integrated definitions of words such as polyamory and theodicy in the narrative. Even older teens will appreciate the discussions about microaggressions and white privilege. **VERDICT** After reading this book, teens will want to fight for social justice. Polaris Tip of the Week

Placing BIB Level Hold Requests

It is recommended that staff place BIB Level hold requests whenever possible. Unless a patron wants a specific volume or part, there is no need to place a copy (item) specific hold. Copy specific holds hinder the system's ability to fill the request with the first available copy. The only way a copy specific hold can be satisfied is if that specific barcode is scanned at check-in.

- Search for the patron using **Patron Status** or **(F6)**. Open the patron's status. Click once on the **Place Hold** icon. The Hold Request work form will display.
- Click once on the **Find** button in the Bibliographic section to search for a title. Double click on the desired Bibliographic record.

Diana Frances Spencer, b. July 1, 1961, d. Aug. 31, 1997, the daughter of the 8th Earl Spencer, married Charles, Prince of Wales on July 29, 1981. The wedding, in Saint Paul's Cathedral, was billed as a "fairy-tale wedding"; it was viewed on television by nearly a billion people around the world. The couple had two sons, Prince William (b. 1982) and Prince Harry (b. 1984).
