





Amanda had the opportunity to attend Trumansburg's Community Read Program last week. This week's Member Library Spotlight highlights this amazing program and she encourages all libraries to check out this amazing book: *George* by Alex Gino.

When Trumansburg's Community Read was announced in early June, the library <u>was hit</u> <u>hard</u> with some scrutiny about the program. Naturally, I stepped into the First Presbyterian Church of Ulysses on August 24, expecting an aggressive environment and was pleasantly surprised when I witnessed something completely different. Director, Annette Birdsall, was setting up chairs for the event and based on the 10 or so chairs initial set up, she was not prepared for 30+ community members that hustled into the circle to grab a chair for the evening program. Of course more chairs were distributed and author, Alex Gino, was skyped into the discussion. One of the first questions they had for Trumansburg was "what happened with the Ithaca.com article?" The participants responded flawlessly; that it was just a few disgruntled folks and the vast majority of the area is in full support of reading and discussing this timely topic with their families. YES!


The discussion of *George* was engaging and included well thought out questions, comments and overwhelming support for queer members of the Tburg community. Alex was engaging and offered a variety of tips to community members on how to be an effective ally and what they personally struggled with as a genderqueer author.

Some Takeaways from the Program:

- Do your research and learn about the vocabulary.
- Never introduce a transperson as who they "used to be." They are who they are and it's not their job to make you feel comfortable.
- When speaking to a transperson, do not dwell on your mistake if you goof on pronouns. Say "excuse me" correct the pronoun, and move on.
- Be who you are!



YA Book of the Week:

Quiet Power: The Secret Strengths of Introverts by Susan Cain

Gr 6 Up—Cain is well known for her adult book and TED Talk on the contributions that introverts have made to society in a world that seems powered by extroverts. In this edition, she addresses the challenges that young introverts face. Unfortunately for introverts, who make up one-third to half the population, those who often seem to thrive most in school or public situations are the extroverts. Cain believes that introverts, like her, can learn to use their "superpowers" (namely: listening, deep thinking, and focusing on the self) to flourish. The book is divided into chapters based on school, socializing, hobbies, and home, with firsthand accounts of introverted teens and examples of famous figures (e.g., Beyoncé, Albert Einstein) who have found success outside of their initial comfort zones. Included are strategies and tips on how introverts can overcome situations that prove difficult for them (preparing notes to enter class discussions, establishing a time limit for social outings, setting up a personal sanctuary). Humorous drawings throughout the text add a whimsical and light

touch perfect for the intended audience. This highly accessible volume gives a voice to a group of people who are often made to feel unappreciated. There is no index, but the work does include notes, an afterword for teachers, and a guide for parents. VERDICT Many will find value in this title that emphasizes that being an introvert is not a blemish on one's personality but a benefit. An excellent addition.—Elizabeth Kahn, Patrick F. Using the Polaris Leap Picklist:

You will be presented with a list of items that are requested at other libraries. You can view **Pending**, **Located**, **Unclaimed**, and **Holds to Transfer**.
