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From the Director:



One of the things that was brought up multiple times during our Plan of Service focus groups this summer was the need for more member engagement to our libraries. Many of you suggested that we have FLLS staff spend the day at your libraries so that staff can see what patrons are asking or using your libraries for, and also be available for one on one help with items such as eContent help, marketing help, or programming ideas. As a result of these library conversations, we have re-worked Amanda Schiavulli's job description to become Member Services Librarian.

Starting this fall, Amanda will be traveling to and working remotely from our libraries one day a week as needed by our member libraries. During her time at the libraries, she can meet with you to discuss things like space planning, weeding, collection development, library policies, digital services, and more. In addition to her work with Member Services, she will also be responsible for eContent, databases, collection development, social media creation and monitoring, developing and holding System Meetings, creating and distributing our bulletin, and Youth Services programming and outreach.

In other news, the Pew Research Center released their new report on libraries and library usage. The report is extremely helpful for library directors and Boards to use in public reports and in your advocacy efforts and can be read at <u>http://www.pewinternet.org/2016/09/09/libraries-2016/</u>. Some things might be surprising - such as young adults are more likely to have visited a library last year than those over the age of 65, 19 % of American adults have never visited a library in their life, and that borrowing printed books is still the most popular activity at libraries. I highly encourage you to read and use the article's findings in the development of future long range planning for your library.

Be Aware: Scam of the Month



There is a new scam you need to watch out for. In the last few years, online service providers like Google, Yahoo and Facebook have started to send emails to their users when there was a possible security risk, like a log-on to your account from an unknown computer.

Bad guys have copied these emails in the past, and tried to trick you into logging into a fake website they set up and steal your username and password. Now, however, they send these fake security emails with a 1-800 number that they claim you need to call immediately.

If you do, two things may happen:

1) You get to talk right away with a real internet criminal, usually with a foreign accent, that tries to scam you. They claim there is a problem with your computer, "fix" it, and ask for your credit card.

2) You get sent to voice mail and kept there until you hang up, but your phone number was put in a queue and the bad guys will call you and try the same scam.

Remember, if you get any emails that either promise something too good to be true, OR look like you need to prevent a negative consequence, Think Before You Click and in this case before you pick up the phone.

If you decide to call any vendor, go to their website and call the number listed there. Never use a phone number from any email you may have received. Here is a real example of such a call. Don't' fall for it! http://cdn2.hubspot.net/hubfs/241394/phone_phish.mp3



What is TBBL and How Can Your Library Benefit?



Talking Book and Braille Library lends audiobooks for free to people who have difficulty using printed materials due to medical reasons. The audiobook cartridges are sent through the mail from the New York State Library in Albany. Shipping is free both ways! In addition, audiobook titles can also be downloaded instantly from their online library, *Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD)*. TBBL provides a free

player to each patron (pictured above), and you can also transfer electronic BARD files to a wide range of devices. Likewise, Braille items are also available by mail or download.





YA Book of the Week:

What do you really want? How to set a goal and go for it by Beverly Bachel

Setting and sticking to goals can ease stress and anxiety, boost concentration, and make life more satisfying. This updated and revised edition of a trusted step-by-step guide helps teens articulate their goals and put them in writing, set priorities and deadlines, overcome obstacles, build a support system, use positive self-talk, celebrate successes, and more. Updated with new and inspiring stories from teens pursuing their goals, easy-to-use tips for setting and reaching goals, and information on using technology tools to aid in goal setting, the book also includes downloadable forms to use in goal-setting activities.

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Subject Searching: When searching for a specific subject, try a Bibliographic Browse search. For example, a patron wants to start raising goats and has no idea where to start.

1. Open the Find Tool, go to **Cataloging -> Bibliographic Records (F12)**. Change **By** to Subject, **Type** to Browse, and enter your general subject term (ex. "goats") in the **For** field.

2. Click on **Search** or hit the **Enter** key on your keyboard. Several subject headings will populate the results window.

3. Double click on a heading to see the records associated with that subject heading.



What is the mission of ALA's Office of Intellectual Freedom? Why should you care about censorship?

Established December 1, 1967, the Office for Intellectual Freedom is charged with implementing ALA policies concerning the concept of intellectual freedom as embodied in the <u>Library Bill of Rights</u>, the Association's basic policy on free access to libraries and library materials.

The goal of the office is to educate librarians and the general public about the nature and importance of intellectual freedom in libraries and to support librarians, teachers, and administrators undergoing a material or service challenge.

You should care about censorship because not only does it violate our First Amendment rights, but public libraries are to be seen as safe havens for learning regardless of the personal beliefs of the staff.

"Censorship reflects a society's lack of confidence in itself. It is a hallmark of an authoritarian regime" — Supreme Court Justice Potter Stewart, dissenting Ginzberg v. United States, 383 U.S. 463 (1966)
