## From Executive Director Amy Zuch

The Seneca County Board of Supervisors voted on Tuesday, March 12<sup>th</sup> to maintain flat funding for the Seneca County Libraries and FLLS for 2013. Sally Eller, trustee at the Edith B. Ford Memorial Library of Ovid, and Amy Zuch from FLLS spoke on behalf of the libraries and the system. More than one supervisor commented on the temporary nature of their support; they are voting to provide funding to the libraries for 2013, but cannot guarantee that they will vote this way in the future. Continued education and advocacy are needed!

# <u>Computer and Network Services Training Schedule Update by Jan</u> <u>Aguirre</u>

Simply Reports - designing reports, using filters, selecting fields, sorting, exporting. Simply Reports is **THE** place to go if all the other canned reports just do not display or retrieve the results you want. Does the information in a record set not include everything you want to see? Select that record set in Simply Reports and you decide what information is displayed and in what order. If you are frustrated with searching for that special report and not finding exactly what you need, this workshop will help you design that custom report, save it for future use and export it where you need it.

- Need to identify the top 100 most active Adult users in the last year?
- How about the top 25 most popular Adult Fiction books last year?
- Want to send out a mass email to the most active patrons with children about the summer reading program this year?
- Want to find all your patrons that have selected email notification to receive notices but no email address is in their patron record?
- After you create a record set of items you plan to withdraw, wouldn't it be nice if that
  record set displayed relevant information that would help you determine if this title needs
  to be replaced?

All these queries, and so many more, can be created easily and quickly in Simply Reports. The first workshop on this topic is April 5<sup>th</sup> here at FLLS in our conference room. This webinar is aimed at reference staff with little or no experience in genealogy, and will introduce online tools for assisting patrons with family history research.
