FLLS 2019 Annual Meeting

Thank you to all who attended our 61st FLLS Annual Meeting on Friday, October 18! We had over 85 member library trustees, directors, staff, and volunteers join us at the beautiful Shepard Hills Country Club in Waverly. For photos of the day, check our Facebook and Instagram pages.

During the business portion of our meeting, we heard from Jean Currie, our regional representative from the Library Trustee Association. Jean went over the administrative changes at LTA and explained the process of LTA joining NYLA as a section. Jean and I also discussed the importance of trustee education.

The Chair of our Policy Committee, Martin Toombs, explained recent FLLS Board Bylaw changes to account for the requirement of sexual harassment prevention training and to cover the removal of trustees. Both changes were ratified by the membership. The membership also elected two new FLLS trustees. Cynthia Mannino, a trustee at the Trumansburg Library, was elected for the at-large position. Micci Bogard was elected for the Seneca County position and is a trustee at the Lodi Library. Both trustees start their terms in January 2020.

Our speaker this year was Stephanie "Cole" Adams. She is the attorney for the "Ask the Lawyer" service through our regional library council. Ms. Adams has a deep connection to libraries after working at her hometown library in New Hartford, NY and her college libraries. Her talk, "Legal Issues Facing Libraries Today", covered a variety of topics, including library bylaws, policies, job descriptions, copyright, how to deal with law enforcement requests, and more. Ms. Adams' presentation was our highest ranked presentation as gleaned from the meeting evaluations.

The FLLS Annual Meeting committee is still working to determine what our membership would like for future meetings. The goal for the committee is to give a recommendation to the FLLS Board by January.



FLLS ending use of Hoopla

As of January 1, 2020, the Finger Lakes Library System will no longer offer cardholders free access to streaming platform Hoopla. Five member libraries will be offering Hoopla on their own and patrons from

those select libraries will still be able to access Hoopla with no disruption in service.



The System made this decision after thorough discussion of alternatives and priorities. We believe the pricing model and cost of Hoopla make it unsustainable for the System, and that our resources are more effectively used purchasing more in-demand content through other platforms.

Is there something about you that others would be surprised to know? I lived in London for a year and have been back three times since.




