**Self-Directed Program** definition: self-directed activities arranged and set out by library staff that are for a limited time (for example: weekly or monthly), are calculated by individual participation (including parents/caregivers) and, if they are for younger children, are interactive with a caregiver. It does not include coloring pages or displays. Activities/crafts included in scheduled program such as storytime are not counted separately. For example: a STEM activity set out for one month and participated in by 18 children and 10 caregivers equals 1 program and 28 in attendance.
