FROM THE DIRECTOR

Here are some highlights for you from the last few weeks:

NY State Construction Aid for Libraries – Earlier this week, the State Library released construction aid budget figures for the 23 public library systems. FLLS will have \$905,464 to distribute to our libraries seeking construction projects. The Library Development Grants portal will open on June 7. If your library is thinking of a construction project, please email me by June 9 to let me know. All applications for construction projects must be submitted to FLLS by Friday, September 1. A site visit to your library by me to look at your proposed project is mandatory and must take place before the beginning of August. Please email me with any questions you have on construction projects. We expect a competitive season this year due to some major anticipated projects.

The State Library notified public library systems that next Tuesday, May 30, there will be a major update to the State Aid for Library Construction website. It has been completely revamped and updated with a more accessible and user-centered look. There will be a NYLINE message that will go out when the site goes live on Tuesday with a specific State email address for library comments.

FLLS Annual Meeting – I know October seems a long way off, but please save the date for the FLLS Annual Meeting on Friday, October 13. This will be our first inperson Annual Meeting since 2019 and we look forward to seeing everyone in person again.

Our location this year will be in Auburn at the Hilton Garden Inn. There will be a brief business meeting with trustee elections and a FLLS Bylaw change that our board will present. The FLLS staff is finalizing our guest speaker and will be sending out more information soon. All trustees who attend our Annual Meeting will receive trustee education credits.

Fine Free – Congratulations to the Kellogg Free Library in Cincinnatus for going fine free! FLLS currently has only one library collecting fines on materials and one library collecting fines on DVDs. I am working with the boards of those two libraries to transition to being fully fine free.

FLLS Closed Monday, May 29 – Finger Lakes Library System will be closed on Monday, May 29 to observe Memorial Day. There will be no deliveries. On Tuesday, May 30, all 33 libraries will receive a delivery.






Rediscover Why You Are Here with Priscilla Berggren-Thomas (FLLS)

Wednesday, May 31, 10:00am | FREE Many of us were feeling burned out before Covid, and it's only gotten worse. Between the challenges of the pandemic, sometimes dwindling budgets and circulation statistics, the undeniable amounts of inequality throughout the country, and growing levels of misinformation, more and more it seems that revitalizing libraries requires also revitalizing ourselves and our staff. Along with the need for self-care, Simon Sinek's book Start with Why offers library workers a way to re-envision why we are here and why it matters. What is a library's reason for existing? And why have we chosen to be part of that movement? Come learn and be part of a discussion to rediscover what matters to us as librarians. Hybrid event.

Join us to learn more about this important research and leave with actionable ideas for promoting a healthy work environment for all staff and cultivating empathetic leadership in libraries. The webinar will highlight established and emerging countermeasures for library workers, including promoting work-life balance, encouraging candid communication, and cultivating a supportive workplace culture that allows all employees to thrive.






