FROM THE DIRECTOR

Here are some updates from the last few weeks:

NY State Aid for Library Construction– I have been doing library visits to our libraries that have notified FLLS of their intent to apply for NY State Aid for library construction. We have projects ranging from new libraries (Hazard Library in Cayuga County) to LED lighting and parking lot construction projects. A reminder to those



libraries applying that applications are due to FLLS by Friday, September 1. The FLLS Board of Trustees will be meeting on Wednesday, September 27 to vote on the proposed projects. If you have any questions, please email me.

Construction Webinar – If your library is planning a construction project in the next few years, the State Library is hosting a webinar that may be of interest. <u>Registration is now open</u> for a fall webinar on "Planning for a Library Construction Project" on Tuesday, September 12 from 2:00-3:30pm.

The webinar will be recorded and uploaded to the <u>New York State Library website</u> once closed-captioning work has been completed.

Webinar Description: A construction project is one of the most daunting challenges a librarian can undertake. In partnership with the design firm Sasaki, the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners has developed a set of best practices for designing library space that may be applied to libraries across the nation. In this webinar, MBLC Library Building Specialists Lauren Stara and Andrea Bono-Bunker will provide an overview of the resource and answer questions about library design and construction.

FLLS Annual Meeting – A reminder to save the date for Friday, October 13 for the FLLS Annual Meeting. This meeting will be held in person in Auburn. More information will be sent out soon.


Seneca Falls Library



Participants will leave with a basic vocabulary of signs to use right away. Kathy MacMillan is a nationally certified American Sign Language interpreter, librarian. and storyteller. She is the author of the Little Hands Signing series from Familius Press, Little Hands and Big Hands: Children and Adults Signing Together (Hands Up Press), the co-author of the bestselling Storytime Magic series (ALA Editions), and the creator of many other books for children, teens, librarians, and educators. Save the Date! Thursday, September 7th @ 10 am the Sciencenter will (virtually) host a follow-along kit demo and chat about solar eclipse safety.



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


POLARIS TIP

How to Find a Call Number

OCLC created a great tool called OCLC Classify that would find almost any call number for you. It appears as though they've stopped updating the tool, but you can use WorldCat to help you find a call number for a non-fiction book.

Visit <u>https://www.worldcat.org/</u> and type in the title or the ISBN of the book you are looking for. Click on the appropriate title. You will see a page similar to the image below. Check the box: "*Only public libraries*."



Click **Borrow** next to a specific library or system, Onondaga County Public Library is always a good choice since they also use Polaris.

You will be redirected to the library or system's catalog. Click on **Availability** if it is a Polaris library. You will be presented with the item information, see below. Otherwise, you will have to do some searching around.

We all need to master the knowledge and skills to make smart financial choices and prepare for whatever the future brings. <u>Thinking Money for Kids</u>, an initiative of the American Library Association (ALA) and the FINRA Investor Education Foundation, strives to teach children and their parents, caregivers and educators about financial topics — like saving, spending, sharing and budgeting — in a way that is both meaningful and fun.

ALA and the FINRA Foundation invite public libraries to apply to receive a **Thinking Money for Kids Program Kit**, a collection of expertly vetted resources to help libraries offer financial education for children ages 3 to 12, both in the library and in children's homes.

Approximately 200 public libraries will be selected to receive a Thinking Money for Kids Program Kit (estimated kit value: \$2,000). Libraries will keep all kit contents after the grant period ends. Each selected library will receive the following:

- All materials needed to host five different in-person children's programs such as ready-to-use games, props and other physical materials — for children ages 3 to 12.
- A set of Playaway Launchpad tablets pre-loaded with digital content that aligns with the in-person program offerings.
- Program instructions, talking points, related book lists and other resources to assist library workers in planning and hosting the in-person programs.
- Template promotional materials and digital graphics to assist library workers with marketing the programs and Launchpad tablets to the public.
- Access to virtual training and a community of practice.

ALA will accept online applications for this opportunity from June 15 to September 8, 2023. The programming period will run from September 2024 through December 2025. See important links below:
