FROM THE DIRECTOR

Thank you for joining us for our first newsletter of 2024. Here are some updates for you:

FLLS Staffing - During November, our business manager parted ways with FLLS. We received temporary business help from a local accountant who worked with us 5 hours a week while we advertised for the position. We received some great applications and completed our interviews last week. I am happy to report that we extended an offer to our top applicant and on January 10, he accepted. Carlos Perez will be joining FLLS staff on February 5 as our business manager. He is coming to us from TCAT, where he worked in accounting.



During our upcoming FLLS Board of Trustees meeting on January

17, the trustees will be updating the Computer Network Services Manager job description and salary and we will be reposting that job announcement. This was the position that Rex held for us that been vacant since June. Our next goal is to have a replacement for that position in the next few months.

Tom has notified FLLS staff and our directors that he is healing nicely from his eye surgery and on schedule to return to driving on Monday, January 22. A big thank you to Ken and Rex for sub driving for us while Tom was out.

NY State Budget - Governor Hochul gave her State of the State on Tuesday. While she did focus on literacy and revamping the way reading is being taught in schools, there is no mention of the role of libraries in this endeavor. A reminder that NY State is operating in a deficit, so hopes are slim for a budget increase. The Governor does release her budget on January 16, and NYLA advocacy efforts will increase once those figures are released.

Advocacy Day - Advocacy Day is coming up on February 7. FLLS will not be providing a bus this year due to our staffing (I need to stay in the area and work with our new business manager that week). Instead, we will be focusing on individual meetings with legislators and I will take part on Spring on the Hill, which is a targeted advocacy effort in late April with NYLA and public library system directors. Please look for ways you can send legislators emails regarding library advocacy in the next few weeks shared by NYLA and FLLS.

Annual Reports - We are gearing up for NY State Annual Report time. While we do not have anything official from the State, we expect the portal to open up in late January and that reports will be due to the State from FLLS by the beginning of March. We do not expect any major changes in the reporting and will be helping our libraries by running reports and helping with any questions. Please remember that annual reports must be approved by a library's board of trustees, so please plan to have a meeting in February to approve your reports. Jenny Shonk is our FLLS staff member working with our libraries on Annual Reports, so expect more information from Jenny soon.

FLLS Closed Monday, January 15 – A reminder that we will be closed on Monday, January 15 to observe Martin Luther King Jr. Day. We will not be doing deliveries that day. All libraries will be receiving a delivery on Tuesday, January 16 from FLLS.
