





## FROM THE DIRECTOR

Here are some updates for you from the last few weeks:

**Advocacy Day** – Advocacy Day was held in person in Albany on Wednesday, February 7. While FLLS did not send staff or a bus this year due to staffing, over 400 library advocates from around the state gathered to make sure legislators know that funding libraries is vital. Governor Hochul is proposing the following:

- Library Operating Aid: \$102.1M (+2.5M over FY2023-2024 Enacted)
- Library Construction Aid: \$34M (Level to FY2023-2024 Enacted)
- NOVELNY: \$3M

The exact text included is excerpted below:

"Support for Libraries. The Executive Budget supports public libraries by providing \$102.1 million of Library Aid, a \$2.5 million increase over FY 2024 Enacted Budget levels, and \$34 million for Library Construction to fund various capital projects. In addition, the Executive Budget appropriates \$3 million to ensure continued access to the New York Online Virtual Electronic Library (NOVELny), a free online library of magazines, newspapers, maps, charts, research, and reference books available to all New Yorkers."

The next step in the budget process is one-house budgets from the Senate and Assembly in early March. There are easy ways to show your support of funding libraries to your legislators. You can send emails, make phone calls, set up local visits, or invite your legislators to your libraries for story times, board meetings, or other community events happening at your libraries.

**FLLS Staffing** – Carlos Perez joined our staff on Monday, February 5 as our new Business Manager. He's busy working on monthly board reports and our system's annual report. Our deadline for accepting resumes for the Computer Network Services position ended on February 9 and we received many qualified candidates. We are reviewing resumes and will be conducting first round interviews within the next two weeks.

We are currently accepting applications for a page position at FLLS as our page, Tanner, is leaving FLLS on February 27. We will miss Tanner and his great work with FLLS!

**FLLS Closed Monday, February 19** – A reminder that Finger Lakes Library System will be closed on Monday, February 19 to observe Presidents Day. There will be no deliveries that day. On Tuesday, February 20, all libraries will receive a delivery.



#### Homeschoolers and the Public Library (ELSN)

According to the US Department of Education, the homeschool population has doubled from one to two million in the last decade. For most school districts in New York State, the number of households providing home instruction has more than doubled since the start of the pandemic (NYSED). Is your library prepared to assist the growing homeschool community? ## **POLARIS TIP**

# **Logging On & Off Properly**

It is critical to log on and off correctly!

### To Log On

Double click on the Remote Desktop/Polaris icon on your computer's desktop. The Remote Desktop will open on your screen and you can double click the Polaris icon along the left-hand side of the screen. Enter your unique User Name and Password. **Note:** Passwords are case sensitive.



Having trouble with your receipt printers? You may have logged onto the Polaris toolbar before the printers were able to map completely. It is recommended that you wait a few seconds before opening the Polaris toolbar to ensure that everything loads correctly.

### To Log Off

On the toolbar, go to the **File > Log Off** or **Ctrl L**, then click **OK**. Next, go to **File > Exit** to close the toolbar. Lastly, go to the Windows button in the bottom left-hand corner of the screen, right click, move your mouse to **Shut down or sign out**, and left click on **Sign out**.



Please Note: When closing Polaris, simply clicking on the X on the toolbar or the Remote Desktop without logging off may cause issues with the Polaris server and could impact the entire system!

## **SCRLC Digitization Grants**

SCRLC routinely supports creative proposals to improve regional access and resource sharing through technology. Digitization projects allow materials to be accessed regionally through <a href="New York Heritage">New York State Historic</a>
<a href="Newspapers">Newspapers</a>, the Empire Archival Discovery Cooperative</a>, and the Empire State Immersive Experiences projects. For 2024-2025, applications are especially encouraged for:

- partnerships increasing representation of and with communities that have been historically and systematically oppressed;
- geographically underrepresented communities in the SCRLC region;
- innovative approaches to availing digitized collections, e.g., walking tours, virtual tours (e.g. participation in the 360-degree Empire State Immersive Experience project), and HistoryForge participation.

Applications are due by Friday, April 12, 2024.
