

NYS Budget and Library Funding

The fantastic news is that we finally have a State Budget as of April 20, 2024 and we finally have an increase in library funding! Governor Hochul first proposed a higher budget amount for library aid and both the Senate and Assembly also recommended a higher amount for both library aid and construction aid.

Here's a breakdown:

- Library Operating Aid: \$103.852 million
- Library Construction Aid: \$44 million
- Library Materials Aid: \$6.25/pupil (for schools)
- NOVELny: \$3 million

Sustainable Funding: Referendums

May means it time for the School Budget Vote. NYS uses the school budget vote as a mechanism for libraries to ask their communities for funding through a referendum. Many of our members have their proposition on the ballot this Spring.

Over the next few weeks libraries will be stepping up efforts to communicate their value to the community. While you are allowed to share information on the date, time and location of the vote as well as what the library intends to do with funds if the vote passes (more hours, programming, books, etc.), any messaging that could be viewed as asking for a "yes" vote is strictly prohibited.

That said, trustees often ask if it's okay for them encourage people to vote "yes". You can do so **only** if it is absolutely clear that you are not speaking from the position of a trustee but as a community member. Establishing that boundary is critical.
