



### FROM THE DIRECTOR

The New York State legislature passed its State budget of \$254B for 2025-2026 fiscal year on Thursday, May 8, 2025. While a tentative agreement had been reached weeks before, the final vote had been delayed until May 8, so we were initially unsure of our library allocations. A very large thank you to all of our library advocates throughout the State for their continued advocacy efforts so late in this season.

The State budget portions related to libraries resulted in a roughly 2% increase for categorial aid. Here is the budget breakdown:

- Library Operating Aid: \$106.325M
  - + \$1.725M from Executive
  - +\$2.473M from last year
- Public Library Construction Aid: \$44 M
  - +10M from Executive
  - o = same as last year
- Library Social Worker Pilot Program: \$150,000
  - o New this year
- Novelny (library databases): \$3M
  - o = same as last year
- Love Your Library Fund: \$100,000
  - = amount proposed in Executive
- Dolly Parton Imagination Library: \$1M
  - -\$6M from Executive
  - +\$500,000 from last year



No funds were allocated nor were fees increased to help underwrite the Division of Library Development at the State Library. Due to IMLS being threatened at a federal level, a state-wide supplement of money for this division was originally sought to help lessen the loss of federal money to our State Library.

**County Funding** – In terms of county funding, Tompkins County administration held their first budget meeting for county agencies last week. I took part in that meeting, representing the five rural libraires in Tompkins County and FLLS, and Susan Currie, interim director at TCPL took part for TCPL. The County is recommending a flat budget for agencies and our budget documents will be due to County administration on June 20.

**FLLS Holiday Closure** – Finger Lakes Library System will be closed on Monday, May 26 in observance of Memorial Day. There will be no deliveries that day. On Tuesday, May 27 there will be both a North Route and South Route delivery and all libraries will be receiving deliveries.

I hope everyone has a safe and relaxing holiday weekend!
